

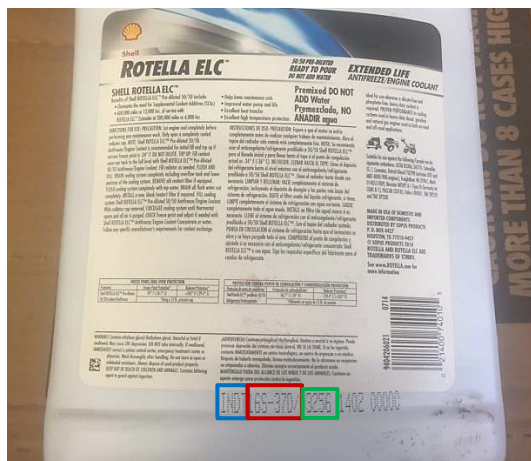
How to Read Batch Codes.

Below are photos of batch codes as they appear on the various pack types. Depending on the product, you may need to check the entire batch code, or individual elements of the batch code. Those elements are explained in the photos below.

Bottles – two batch code formats:



On this bottle, the **batch number** (red) is first, the **facility code** (blue) is second and the **date** (green)—in date/month/year format—is third.

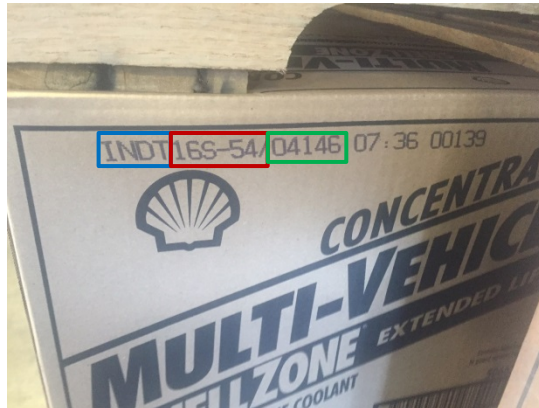


On this bottle, the **facility code** (blue) is first, the **batch number** (red) second and the **date** (green)—with “03256” representing “03/25/16”—is third.

Cases – two batch code formats:



In this photo, the **batch number** (red) is first, the **facility code** (blue) is second and the **date** (green)—in date/month/year format—is third.



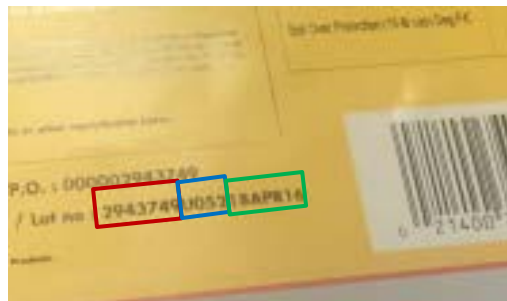
In this photo the **facility code** (blue) is first, the **batch number** (red) second and the **date** (green)—with “04146” representing “04/14/16”—is third.

Drums/Totes – similar labels, one batch code format:

Label on package:

On drums and totes, the batch code is located on the label. The **batch number (red)** is first, the **facility code (blue)** is second and the **date (green)**—in date/month/year format—is third.
